#### Call to Order

Chairman Sanders called the Special Meeting to order at 5:30 P.M.

### Public Hearing – 1st FY 2006 – 2007 Budget

Ruth Williams stated the tentative milliage rate as 3.8437 mills, the roll back rate as 3.3284 mills and the total budget as \$49,657,794.00 and the certified gross taxable value amount as \$4,112,946,852.00. Ms. Williams also announced the date of the final Budget Public Hearing which is Monday, September 18, 2006 at 5:30 PM at the Franklin County Courthouse Annex.

Chairman Sanders opened the floor for public comment.

Ann Murizak read a letter that she distributed and stated how the increased property values are affecting her.

Dick Dosik compared Franklin County spending to other Counties in Florida and had additional comments on the amount of the budget versus services provided.

Richard Harper discussed the vote on the Budget and thanked Commissioner Mosconis for his service.

Commissioner Mosconis commented on the reality market crash and discussed the effects that crash would have on the FY 2007-2008 Budget.

Commissioner Crofton commented on affordable housing and the rising cost of living in Franklin County.

Commissioner Lockley stated the millage rate of Franklin County was one of the lowest in the State and there were not many complaints of services that have been provided by the County.

Chairman Sanders stated that even though the Commission was accused of dividing the County her main purpose was to keep the community unified, as it was during the last major hurricane. Chairman Sanders made other statements regarding the budget.

Ron Schlitt asked about other options to balance the budget besides raising taxes. Board and Mr. Pierce discussed other options and other funds sources included in the budget.

**WHEREAS**, the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS of Franklin County, Florida, on September 6, 2006, adopted Fiscal Year 2006-2007 <u>Tentative</u> <u>Millage Rate</u> following a public hearing as required by Florida Statute 200.065; and

WHEREAS, the gross taxable value for operating purposes not exempt from taxation within Franklin County has been certified by the County Property Appraiser to the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS as \$4,112,946,852.00

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS of Franklin County, Florida that:

The Fiscal Year 2006-2007 *tentatively adopted operating millage rate* for Franklin County is **3.8437** mills which is greater than the rolled-back rate of **3.3284** mills by **15.48%**.
